Dear Parents:

Thank you for your interest in Immaculate Conception Catholic School. When you choose a Catholic school, you choose the best for your child. Catholic school students have the highest national test scores in math, reading, and science. Catholic school students have the highest graduation rate - over 95% - and the lowest dropout rate in the country. More than 80 % of Catholic high school students go on to college.

Of course, not every aspect of a Catholic school education can be measured by a national test. There are no tests to measure character, family values, or other traits that make for a well-balanced person. You can be sure a Catholic school will instill in your child a strong set of morals, love of country, and sense of spirituality; in short, the kinds of traits that make for a good citizen.

Our tuition information is enclosed. A non-refundable registration fee of \$250.00 for new students is due at the time the application is submitted. Also, a non-refundable tuition down payment of \$300.00 is due with your application. Need-based financial assistance is available.

Please provide a copy of the following documents when you apply for registration: birth certificate, baptismal certificate (if Catholic), and a current immunization record. A physical is required for all new students and <u>must be completed</u> on The Diocese of Fort Worth form. Please obtain a physical form from the school office or you may download a copy from our website. In grades 3-8, please provide two letters of recommendation with your application. These letters of recommendation should be from your child's teacher, principal, and/or church youth group director.

The primary objective of our school is to join with our families and our parishes in development of children to their highest potential in learning the Catholic faith, academic excellence, and citizenship. Once again, thank you for your interest.

ADMISSION: Students of any race, color, and national or ethnic origin are admitted.

The school is sponsored by parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St. Mark parishes and will initially give preference to those members of

these two parishes.

REGISTRATION: Amounts due with your application: 1) a non-refundable registration fee

of \$250.00 per child is required for **new** students. 2) a non-refundable tuition deposit of \$300 for all students. An interview with the Principal and two letters of recommendation are required for families who have children entering grades 3^{rd} through 8^{th} . If a child is not accepted, the

registration fee will be refunded.

RECORDS: Please submit a copy of your child's certified birth certificate, baptismal

certificate (if Catholic), and shot records at registration. A physical (form provided by the Diocese of Ft. Worth) and an emergency record

card is required before the first day of school.

Discounts for multiple students: \$500 for 2nd child, \$1100 for 3rd child, \$1800 for 4th child, and \$3700 for 5th child.

^{**}Tuition rates and fees are set and are usually announced by Advisory Council at the time of registration. Tuition & fees include a \$200 building fee and an activity fee of \$220 PK-5th and \$325 6th -8th. Included in 6th-8th grade tuition and fees is a \$10 charge for a flash drive and lanyard. There are no multiple children discounts for 2 and 3 day Pre-K and NC students. These fees are subject to change. Pre-K child-care credit should apply on income tax.

TUITION AND REFUND POLICY: Tuition with fees is due in full on August 3, or through a 10-month payout to FACTS Tuition Management Program. There is no interest fee charged, but a fee of \$75/child, payable to ICCS, is due with the application. FACTS Tuition Management charges a \$41 per family, which is debited from your account. Payments are made directly to FACTS July through April using a bank draft. All families using the FACTS payment plan must register on-line. Visit our website at www.catholicschooldenton.org and look for the "eCashier" logo. It is the responsibility of the parents to notify the school administration of temporary financial difficulties. Amount of non-refundable tuition that must accompany this form per child is: \$300, plus the non-refundable New Student fee of \$250. FACTS fees payable to ICCS are due at the time of registration All fees are non-refundable, and tuition will not be refunded unless relocating out of the DFW area. If refunded, a 10% withdrawal fee will apply.

Promotion Fee for Eighth Grade: \$50.00 per student

Sports Fee: \$75 per child who participates.

Volunteer Fee: \$250 or 25 service hours per family

Yearbook Fee: \$30 per Family

Technology Fee for Grades 5-8: \$50 per student

Tuition Assistance: Immaculate Conception Catholic School provides needs-based financial assistance at the local level with some assistance also available through the Catholic Diocese of Ft. Worth. Families are required to file a confidential application through FACTS. Designed to serve as a national standard of objective measurement of ability to pay for elementary and secondary education, the FACTS Need Analysis System assumes that if parents have chosen a non-public education for their children, they have an obligation to finance that education to the best of their ability. The income and assets of the family are taken into account, as well as the size of the family, age of the parents, the number of children attending tuition charging schools, the state and/or metropolitan area where the family resides, the value of parents' assets, and the number of working parents. FACTS asks each family to complete a simple non-intimidating application form that is available in both English and Spanish to be considered for financial assistance at the diocesan and school level. Please contact the school office for information.

SCHOOL HOURS: The school day for grades Kindergarten through 8th grade begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 3:05 p.m. Pre-K begins at 8:00 a.m. and ends at 2:55 p.m. Before and after school extended day services will be provided for 1 hour before school and until 6:00 p.m. after school at a rate of \$4.00/hour. A registration fee of \$50.00 is required for all children using the Extended Day Program. Extended Day Registration Forms are available in the school office.

UNIFORMS: Uniforms are required and can be purchased through Parker School Uniforms in Carrollton, Texas. Please also check with Parker for the preferred school shoes. PreK uniforms and other optional uniform items are purchased through the ICCS Spirit Shop.

HSA: Membership in the Home & School Association is automatic by virtue of a child attending ICCS.

ACCREDITATION: In April of 2002, Immaculate Conception Catholic School was granted Full Accreditation from the Texas Catholic Conference Accreditation Commission (TCCEC), an organization approved by the Texas Private School Education Commission and recognized by the Texas Education Agency.
